

seats in a section closer to the action



#### Matt's Trivia, From the Archives

Original Publication Summer 2019

Late this past winter and early spring I started on a home improvement project of restoring and refinishing all of our hardwood floors in the second story of our 1918 home, which was my wife's idea. Years ago, we replaced the carpeting and I remember what type of flooring was underneath that old carpet. At the time I thought, why are we covering up hardwood floors with carpet? With a little work these could be beautiful. Well we covered them up, and now over 25 years later decided to rip out the carpet once again and bring back

to life the original hardwood floors. After many hours of sanding, finishing, waxing and buffing three rooms including the walk-in closets are completed! While I was doing this project my wife also mentioned she read an article about the hardwood floors that are used for the NCAA Final Four tournaments. With all of this talk of hardwood floors she thought I should do some trivia about the hardwood floor created for the men's NCAA Final Four Tournament.

Did you know that the NCAA orders four new portable floors every year for the men's and women's regional games and one each for the men's and women's Final Four games? They also ordered a new floor for the Final Four fan fest held at the Minneapolis Convention Center this past March.

Do you know where the wood comes from for these floors? The Maple wood comes from a forest area in Northeast Wisconsin. The planks of wood are sent to a small town in Amasa, Michigan where the company Connor Sports makes the floor panels.

Did you know that it took around 400 panels measuring 4x7 feet and weighing around 180 pounds each to create the Final Four floor used at U.S. Bank Stadium?

Did you know that it takes about six months from the time they are milled to the installation of the floor at a cost of around \$100,000 each?

On an ending note, our home's restored hardwood floors will always remind me of the year the NCAA Final Four tournament was held in Minnesota and won by the University of Virginia, which is in Charlottesville, Virginia where my daughter and her husband live. Those hardwood floors will also remind me of the year my daughter became a Hoos fan!
