





In Rochester Why Here?


Writing this article, spring isn't here quite yet. It's negative ten degrees and it makes me wonder sometimes, "Why here?"





When robins arrive they say only 3 snows left and then it will be spring! Would someone please go south and get the robins now and bring them north!!!


