Rochester Recipes: Poch's Pantry

Time to Indulge with Tom & Jerry... and Not the Cartoon!

From Poch's Pantry, I bring you a little holiday cheer to warm the soul. All too often the holiday season can feel like a Tom and Jerry cartoon episode! However, the frothy and comforting Tom and Jerry cocktail is perfect for chasing away the cold of winter. It's a way of bringing friends and families together (age 21 and above of course) and warming up the conversation.

Tom and Jerry recipes are available everywhere, but this one comes to us from Jim Oeltienbruns...our fearless Rochester leader. I haven't tried this one yet, but he has assured me it is a great recipe and fun to make while your company is gathering. Any recipe that calls for 2 pounds of powdered sugar has to be great! The invention of the Tom and Jerry cocktail is generally credited to British journalist Pierce Egan in the 1820's. Mr. Egan wrote a book, and subsequent play, called *Life in London*. in which the main characters are named Tom and Jerry. It is believed that he introduced the cocktail as a way to promote his book and play. Jerry Thomas, who is considered the father of modern mixology, was known to claim that he invented the Tom and Jerry, and although he published a similar egg-based cocktail in his 1862 book How to Mix Drinks (or The Bon-Vivant's Companion), most historians agree that Egan is the true originator.

Regardless of how it came to be, it is certainly worth enjoying!

Tom & Jerry Recipe

- Ingredients:
- 1 Dozen Eggs
- 2 lbs. powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon allspice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1⁄4 teaspoon cream of tartar
- ½ teaspoon baking soda

Directions:

Separate eggs



- Add cream of tartar to egg whites, beat until stiff. Add 1 lb. of powdered sugar and beat again.
- Beat yolks until light, add 1 lb. of powdered sugar and beat again.
- Fold two mixtures together adding cinnamon, allspice, salt and baking soda.

When batter is complete, add a healthy scoop to a mug. Hot water and brandy or spiced rum is added and then topped off with a dash of nutmeg.

Selecting the Right Crop Insurance Options for Your Operation

A few reminders from F & M Insurance Services:

Insurance coverage ends at the earliest of:

- Total destruction of the crop;
- Harvest of the unit;
- Final adjustment of a loss;
- Abandonment of the crop;
- September 30, 2018 (silage); or
- December 10, 2018 (grain)

Granted, you have until April 29, 2019 to report your production; however, many are in loss situations due to production and harvest price. Production reporting will be necessary to adjust the loss. The adjuster will need all required information to work your claim in a timely manner. **[r]**

Our next important deadline is March 15, 2019 which is the sales closing date for Spring-seeded crops. Please contact Dan Root or Cherrie Brink at our respective locations with regard to your operation's risk management planning.
